The Paddy cultivation and Fisheries are major important self-employment in Thirukkovil D.S.division. It has had a considerable contribution to the economy of the area and on the total production of the country. Even though there is no improvement of their life at expected level. So we must analysis which self-employment contributed to fulfill their all needs to improve standard of living.

Data on variables, such as Basic needs, Self-employment, Income and Saving, Technology, Infrastructure, and Government and NGOs were collected through the questionnaires of 100 involving this self-employment that were randomly selected from 22 G.S. divisions in Thirukkovil D.S.division. The questionnaires have been filled during the period between 20th of March and 28th of April. The univariate analysis was made through computer package SPSS 11.0.

Although the result of this study reveals paddy cultivation is contributed to improve their standard of living than fisheries relates to all variables. Even though paddy cultivation is too improvement in such level. This is the evidence, that no one take ongoing activities to improve standard of living on this community. This study shows that the mean value for overall view of the variable, that are 3.4100 and 2.5000 from paddy cultivation and fisheries respectively.

It is recommended, that, in order to improve paddy cultivator and fisheries standard of living, government and non-governmental organization and their activities should be mainly focused on these community.
