"Rehabilitation and Reconstruction Programmes in Kalmunai Tamil Divisional Secretariat Division After Tsunami Disaster".



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ABSTRACT

On boxing day, 26th December 2004, coastal areas of the countries around the Indian ocean, including Sri Lanka were hit by a tsunami, caused by an earth quack off the coast of the Indonesian island of Sumatra. It killed over 300,000 people in Asia and Africa, about 40,000 in Sri Lanka alone. It destroyed home and buildings, road, railways and other infrastructure facilities, This unprecedented disaster made numerous impacts on economic sector of Ampara district. According to the government over 10,000 people were killed there and more than ten times that number made homeless. Kalmunai Tamil D.S Division was also severely affected in Ampara District due to the tsunami.

So that I have to start research study that "Rehabilitation and Reconstruction programmes after the tsunami disaster in Kalmunai Tamil D.S.Division". The main objectives of this research is that to find out the affected people details and what type of affected, to find out necessary factors to improve the socio economic conditions of this division as well as physical and psychological condition of affected people, identify the way to create facilities and respect of the affected people through participation of government and non government organizations and finally to find out the way to rehabilitate and reconstruction of this division from affected.
