This research analysis the activities of NGOOS towards agriculture sector are effective or not.

Objectives of this research are Identify the activities of NGOOS towards agricultural development, Identify the weakness and drawbacks of the activities of NGOOS in the agricultural sector and Recommend feasible solution to get rid of those problems and give ideas for the effective activities of NGOOS on agricultural development in Vavuniya district.

The methodology used in carrying out this research on this topic "Contribution of NGOOS on agricultural development in Vavuniya district" is the collection of primary and secondary data in relation to the topic.
