A STUDY ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF ANIMAL HUSBANDRY IN KANTHALE D.S DIVISION



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ABSTRACT

Animal husbandry is an important economic activity, which provides reasonable income and valuable protein supplement in the form of milk, meat and eggs to the people in the world. It also provides employment and stimulate trade at all levels. The growing demand for livestock products will stimulate livestock production, which can, if well planned, contribute to poverty alleviation. Therefore I made a research on "Study on the Development of Animal Husbandry in Kant hale D.S. Division.
