## ABSTRACT

This paper is aimed at analyzing the operating expense of selected companies in Sri Lanka. The operating expense is dependent by using three dimensions. Such as,

- 1. Administrative expense
- Selling and distribution expense
- 3. Financial expense

This study attempted to give some knowledge about the analysis of operating expense of selected companies in Sri Lanka. According to the results show that there is high level in administrative expense, moderate level in selling and distribution expense and low level in financial expense of the selected companies in Sri Lanka.
