

**STUDY ON THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN LIQUIDITY AND
PROFITABILITY OF LISTED COMPANIES IN COLOMBO
STOCK EXCHANGE**
(A COMPARISON STUDY AMONG THREE SECTORS)



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ABSTRACT

Profitability and liquidity are the most prominent issues in the corporate finance literature. The ultimate goal for any firm is to maximize profitability. However, too much attention on profitability may lead the firm into a pitfall by diluting the liquidity position of the organization. In this way, the present study is initiated to find the relationship between liquidity and profitability. The study covered thirty listed companies which were selected from manufacturing, services and trading sectors in Colombo Stock Exchange over the period of five years from 2011 to 2015. Liquidity was measured by using current ratio and quick ratio and profitability was measured by using return on assets, return on equity and return on capital employed. Descriptive analysis, correlation analysis and regression analysis were used in analysis and finding suggests that there is significant and weak negative relationship between liquidity and profitability of selected manufacturing companies in CSE and companies in services sector have very weak negative relationship between liquidity and profitability while that relationship is statistically insignificant. There is partially significant and negative relationship between liquidity and profitability of trading sector in CSE. Finally it was concluded that, level of liquidity and profitability varied from sector to sector and also strength of negative relationship between liquidity and profitability varied from sector to sector. However, the findings of this research are based on a study conducted on the selected companies from three sectors. Hence, the results are not generalizable to companies in other sectors. The finding is more useful to financial managers of companies for taking sound decisions on proper tradeoff between liquidity and profitability.
