ABSTRACT

The business or trade commenced in bartering system is now being carried out on internet. In the mean time, the war situation in the country leads the entrepreneurs in a failure. This is not an exceptional owe to our country especially North and East. Owing to the war in the past, practically in North and East, Tamil entrepreneurs are in under poverty and distress. These Tamil involved in various enterprises to streamline their lives. This research is based upon the Tamil entrepreneurship development

The main aim of this study is to identify their competencies in the business successfully run by them and to find the short comings and problems, which they face in their entrepreneurship. This evaluation will also be helpful to the other entrepreneurs who have much to learn from the Tamil and thereby to find their own competencies in the field of business enterprises. For the evaluation purpose there are three factors are taken into consideration, which are personal background, entrepreneurial competencies and institutional support.
