## ABSTRACT

Financial Planning is the process of estimating the capital required and determining its competition because planning involves looking well into the future, it is a highly creative thinking process as well as an analytical one. This research is design to study the extent of practice financial planning practice in the small business organizations in Gampaha district through variables of this study namely preparation Cost Volume Profit Analysis, Cash flow Management and Budgeting with special reference to Small Business Organizations in Gampaha District as the Small Business Organizations increasingly recognized as the prime vehicle for economic development in both developed and developing nations.

The study was conducted among 100 Small Business Organization in Gampaha District. The structured questionnaire was administrated to collect the data from the respondents. The collected data were analysed by using Univariate analysis descriptive measure, such as mean and stranded deviation and cross tabulation.

The result of the study showed that there is a moderate level of Financial Planning Practices among the Small Business Organizations in Gampaha district. The extent of practicing Financial Planning Practices evaluated with Industry sector, Years of Operation, Professional Qualification of owner or financial manager and Working Experience of owner or financial manager in the business there are some lightly differences were observed. The result of this study showed that Cost Volume Profit analysis properly practiced at lower level, Cash Flow Management used at moderate level and Budgeting practices regularly pursue at moderate level. Findings of the study will be important and useful for owners of Small Business Organizations in Gampaha district on exploring empirical knowledge regarding the concept Financial Planning practise.
